### What are the three main functions of the skeletal system?

Ach is the most frequent form of dwarfism, characterized by short long bones, disproportional shortening of the proximal skeletal segments (rhizomelia), impaired elbow extension, tibial bowing, exaggerated lumbar lordosis, shortening of the vertebral pedicles and narrowing of the lumbar interpedicular distance, shortening of the femoral head, macrocephaly, midface hypoplasia, frontal bossing ...
