Solving Simple Equations. When solving a simple equation, think of the equation as a balance, with the equals sign (=) being the fulcrum or center. Thus, if you do something to one side of the equation, you must do the same thing to the other side. Doing the same thing to both sides of the equation (say, adding 3 to each side) keeps the equation balanced.

Solving Equations - MATH

Solving an equation means to find the solution of the given equation. A simple equation has an equal (=) sign. This equality shows the balance of both the sides of the equation. The equation remains the same when the expressions are interchanged.

Answer: A simple equation represents the relationship between two expressions. It has two algebraic expressions on either side of an equal sign. There is an unknown variable term in a simple equation, and solving the equation will deduce the value of the variable.
